C6/17 That for 2018 we increase the number of Horsemanship riders from 10-15 members (dependant on the quality of applications)

C7/17 That the note on page 3 of the Campdraft rules be amended so that it reads

NOTE — At State Campdrafting Championships riders who do not obtain an outside score in the first round shall not be placed ahead of those who do. This note does not apply to a two-round competition.

- C8/17 That the terms for the National Coaching Committee Charter not be retrospectively implemented.
- C9/17 That any future increase to Pony Club Australia Capitation fee not exceed the CPI without prior approval of the member states and territories.
- C10/17 Delete 13.3.1.2 of the Pony Club Australia Constitution which reads:
Elected Board members may not hold a position as an office position with a member's state - and renumber the constitution accordingly.
- C11/17 It is recommended that horses not be loaded (with rider and tack) by more than 20% of the horses weight, at all levels.
- C12/17 That horses entered in jumping events in NSW must be at least four (4) years of age as at 1 August each year.
- C15/17 That all club captains hold as a minimum a Pony Club NSW Gear Check Certificate. This must be implemented by the 20 November 2017.
- C16/17 Team Penning that two (2) live runs be held (not 2 rounds) with equal scores being decided on times.
- C17/17 That at the State Campdraft Championships the Zone Manager, or one other person as nominated by the Zone Team Manager, be allowed to assist the rider with the selection of his or her beast (nominated persons must be advised at the Team Manager's meeting).

- C28/17 That an amendment be made to C33/15 – C35/15, and include jumping equation to the list of previously approved amendments.

To assist zone events remain viable and meet the needs of riders, it is recommend the below approved amendments be further amended to include zone events, and that jumping equitation be considered as a suitable discipline to allow a second horse.

Amendment to read (see bold and underline for amendments)

- That at **Zone**/Club Level Showjumping competitions, riders (graded C or above) may be permitted to participate on two horses. (One horse competitively, the other non-competitively). The 2nd horse can be either lower, higher or the same grade. If the second

- non-competitive horse was in the same grade then the second non-competitive horse would be ridden last.

The decision to allow 2 entries per rider will be at the discretion of the host zone/ club.

- That at **Zone/Club Level Dressage** competitions, riders (graded C or above) may be permitted to participate on two horses. (One horse competitively, the other non-competitively). The 2nd horse can be either lower, higher or the same grade. If the second non-competitive horse was in the same grade then the second non-competitive horse would be ridden last.

The decision to allow 2 entries per rider will be at the discretion of the host zone/club.

- That at **Zone/ Club Level One Day Eventing** competitions, riders (graded C or above) may be permitted to participate on two horses. (One horse competitively, the other non-competitively). The 2nd horse can be either lower, higher or the same grade. If the second non-competitive horse was in the same grade then the second non-competitive horse would be ridden last.

The decision to allow 2 entries per rider will be at the discretion of the host **Zone/ club**

- **That at Zone/ Club Level Jumping Equitation competitions, riders (graded C or above) may be permitted to participate on two horses. (One horse competitively, the other non-competitively). The 2nd horse can be either lower, higher or the same grade. If the second non-competitive horse was in the same grade then the second non-competitive horse would be ridden last. The decision to allow 2 entries per rider will be at the discretion of the host Zone/ club**

- C29/17 That the use of a pick-up strap is allowable to be used when playing or practicing Horseball; pick up straps should run through the loop on the martingale under the horse's belly, i.e., they should not hang unrestricted.
- C30/17 That the Toronto Flag, Ball Race, Post the Letter and Diamond Flag as already described be left or right handed courses.
- C31/17 That payment of \$500 grant be made to Jindabyne Pony Club.
- C32/17 That approval be granted for Jenko Pony Club to transfer from Zone 26 to Zone 22.

PONY CLUB NSW VOLUNTEER AWARDS

The 2017 Pony Club NSW Volunteer Award Nominations are now open for Volunteer of the Year, Keith Lowe Award, Junior Service Award and Club of the Year. Nominations will close on the 25th June.

Award Nominations received for the NSW Awards will also be considered for the Pony Club Australia National Awards being presented at the National Championships in Toowoomba. The National Awards include Best achievement by a rider under 17 years, Best achievement by a rider 17-25 years, Pony Club Alumnus, Coach of the Year, Volunteer of the Year, Club of the Year.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECKS (WWCC)

All clubs should now be complainant with the Working With Children Check regulations and registered as an 'employer/organisation' in order to verify their 'employees/volunteers'. A clubs status must be reviewed every year and clubs need to complete a risk assessment on anyone 18 years and above to ensure that they are compliant with the Act, see spreadsheet below:

The risk assessment can be done by using a simple spreadsheet as below:

It is **illegal** to use a volunteer who has been deemed as needing a Working with Children Check that has not provided their Working with Children Check registration number and been verified unless they have been classified as exempt by their club/zone. Please ensure that records of all roles including their WWCC number of exemption status are held by the authorised persons within the club/zone as audits will be conducted.

It is also **illegal** to utilise a volunteer who has been banned under the Working with Children Check registration system which is why it is so important for clubs to be registered as 'employers' and for clubs to verify members so that they can be contacted in the event that a volunteer has been banned.

Club must also remember that their Child Safety obligations do not end with Working with Children Checks, clubs need to be mindful of having Child Safe policies and practices, Play by the Rules have some terrific online courses and resources for clubs please see their website for full details - <https://www.playbytherules.net.au/>

CONFLICT RESOLUTION

There are very clear and defined regulations in regard to disputes within Pony Club (see the PCA NSW Hand Book and Member Protection Policy). Clubs and Zones should appoint a Member Protection Information Office (MPIO) to help members with any queries and information in regard to rules, regulations and advise on how to deal with complaints. In all cases conflict should be handled at the lowest level within Pony Club as possible i.e. the channel of communication should be **Member → Club → Zone → State**. In accordance with the Australian Sports Commission

Member Protection Policy (which the Association has adopted) conflicts or complaints may be dealt with informally or formally and all complaints should be dealt with promptly, seriously, sensitively and confidentiality.

All queries and or disputes should be referred in the first instance to the Club/Zone Secretary or President. Complaints should be handled in line with the Member Protection Policy and either referred to an outside mediator, contact Community Justice Centres for help and free mediation - <http://www.cjc.justice.nsw.gov.au/> or if mediation is unsuitable a Disputes Tribunal may be formed by contacting solicitors from the Australian & New Zealand Sports Law Association (ANZSLA) who list solicitors who are willing to participate on a panel usually pro bono please see their website for details <http://anzsla.com/content/sports-tribunal-referral-list>

All policies in relation to Codes of Behaviour and our Member Protection Policy as well as a number of other policies can be found on our web site under the Policies tab then go to the general policies. PCA NSW follows the Australian Sports Commission and Communities of Sports and Recreation guidelines and the Association takes these matters seriously.

ASSOCIATIONS POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

All members are reminded that upon joining Pony Club Association NSW they accept the Associations, Constitution, By-laws, Code of Conduct, Membership Protection Policy and All other policies that the Association adopts from time to time. Any member who breaches any of the rules of Pony club including the Code of Conduct may face disciplinary action. Full details of these policies and procedures can be found on the Associations website under the policy tab.

Please remember that all Club, Zone and State Office Bearers are volunteers and should be treated with respect at all times. These volunteers take on positions in order to ensure that Pony Club continues as an organisation for your children and while they are open to feedback, members should always be considerate and treat others as they would like to be treated.

WORK HEALTH AND SAFETY ACT (WHS)



As you would all be aware the Code of Practice 'Managing Risk When New and Inexperience Riders or Handlers Interact With Horses In The Workplace' came into effect as at 1st February 2017. The impact on Pony Club should be minimal as we were using the Guide which was in effect prior to 1st February. You can download the Code of Practice from either WorkSafe NSW or our website under the <http://www.pcansw.org.au/management/work-health-safety> tab.

Pony Club have developed an Induction and Safe Work Procedure document for clubs to give to new members. This document should be used as guide for clubs to provide onsite inductions for these members.

All new members should be made aware of the Associations Rules (Blue Book), the Riding Handbook and other suitable reading materials such as Horse Safe – A Complete Guide to Equine Safety by Jane Myers available through <http://www.publish.csiro.au/pid/5130.htm> As part of the Associations consultation process the State Office will continue to forward information to all members, Clubs and Zones, outlining Pony Club's responsibilities under the Work Health and Safety Act. If you have any queries or ideas that you would like to share please do not hesitate to contact the state office.

To help Clubs and Zones ensure their compliance under the changes to the Act Pony Club Association NSW is offering FREE Administration Workshops to Zones – please see your Zone to organise an Administration Workshop.

PONY CLUB RULES

The Associations Handbook and all other policies are all available on our website www.pcansw.org.au please make sure that all members are aware of where to find these documents. Members are also reminded that adults are not permitted to ride at pony club unless they are demonstrating an activity or supervising an activity i.e. trail ride, ANZAC day march.

PAID INSTRUCTORS AT PONY CLUB

Zones and Clubs are reminded that only those instructors listed on the Paid Instructor Panel list are permitted to be paid for giving instruction at Pony Club. A list of the current PIP can be obtained from the state office or be found on the web site www.pcansw.org.au under the coaching tab. Please note that payments from clubs for instruction must be received in the office at least four (4) weeks before instruction and must include GST i.e. instructors payment \$500 payment to office \$550.

NCAS SCHOOLS, SPECIALIST AND REGIONAL SCHOOLS

Zones are reminded that there is a \$550.00 refundable deposit fee for all schools. This fee is refunded once the school has been completed. Cancellations of schools and NCAS assessments will incur this fee unless postponed or cancelled within the required time frame i.e. the last working day four weeks before the school is booked for.

The 2017 fee of \$25.00 per rider applies to all Regional Schools and \$20.00 fee PCA NSW members and \$50.00 fee for all non PCA NSW members for Specialist Schools with a minimum of 18 attendees. This fee is due when booking the school and should be sent as a separate cheque to the refundable deposit. Schools can only be booked through ZCI's and forms can be obtained by contacting Jane Frankum on 02 4229 8977 (Tuesday's only) or emailing coach@pcansw.org.au.

Zones are reminded that a roll of participants should be forwarded to the State Office directly after the completion of each school.
