**MYPONYCLUB – NEW MY PONY ACCESS EXPIRATIONS**

Access to MyPonyClub needs to be renewed using the correct application forms (found under the management tab then go to forms on the website) please note that the current access will expire as of the **31st January 2020**.

As per **motion C28/20** That commencing 2021 PCA NSW affiliations and renewals only be available online and payable by credit/debit card all clubs must have an authorised access holder and complete an audit of current membership to ensure that members have valid email addresses for 2021 renewals to be processed.

Each club may have two authorised access holders and forms can be found under the management tab – forms on our website <https://www.pcansw.org.au/management/forms> the office will be contacting all clubs who do not have an authorised access holder in the next few weeks.

Clubs and Zones will need to update their bank account and contact details and update their fees prior 2021 for renewals to be processed, contact the office for support with this process.

**FEES FOR 2020**

**Riding Membership** - \$76.50 per rider

**Non-Riding Membership** - \$40 per person and \$20 for the second non-riding member per family

**Regional Schools** - \$30 per rider total of 18 riders

**State Championship** entry fees - \$45 per rider (this includes first aid levy) for all Championships, administration, stable and camping fees will apply for each championship

**State Camp** - \$250 per rider

**Clinics/Seminars** - \$20 per PCANSW member and \$50 per non-member.

ALL MEMBERS ARE REQUIRED TO COMPLETE A RISK WARNING FORM AT THE TIME OF JOINING OR RENEWING THEIR MEMBERSHIP EACH YEAR (copy to be sent to the state office with payments or can be completed when members renew directly online). All members over the age of 18 must also complete a Child Protection form details in this mail out. The completed forms are to be held by the club in a safe and secure place.

Please note, *date of birth details for all PCANSW members MUST now be provided.* See section on insurance below for details.

**RESUMPTION OF SPORT UNDER COVID SAFETY GUIDELINES**

PCA NSW clubs and zones can conduct all activities under the current NSW Health and Office of Sport guidelines. All clubs and zones must have completed a return to sport risk assessment and Covid Safety Plan and submitted the same to the State Office prior to holding their first activities and events.

Sample risk assessments, Covid Safety Plans and Covid-19 Self-declaration forms can be found on our website <https://www.pcansw.org.au/management/risk-management> to help clubs. Please note that the sample risk assessment focuses solely on Covid safe practices and does not take into consideration all other activities conducted at pony club and clubs should include all risks and what actions they will take to mitigate those risks in their risk assessment documents for all activities to be conducted.

Clubs and zones also need to monitor the NSW Health website and incorporate any recommendations, restrictions etc. into their risk assessments and Covid Safety plans as listed <https://www.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/latest-news-and-updates>

This is a great time to reach out to your members/parents to help with risk assessments, Covid Safety Plans as many of your members/parents will already be dealing with these issues in their workplace. Clubs and Zone need to appoint Covid Safety Coordinators, this position is not instructional, so it is a good role to offer to non-instructor parents.

NSW Health and their authorise representatives will be checking on clubs to ensure that they have Covid Safety Plans (hard copy available at the activity/event) and that members are following all Covid safe practices including staying home if unwell, social distancing, good hand washing hygiene and the wearing of face masks when social distancing is not possible. PCA NSW recommends that everyone attending PCA NSW activities and event wear a face mask when not riding.

**INFORMATION FROM JULY MEETINGS**

- C23/20 That for 2021 only, riders who would have turned 25 in the 2020 calendar year be allowed to ride and compete up to State Championship level in 2021.
- C24/20 That for 2021 only, an exemption on the maximum age of riders competing at the RAS be amended to under 18.
- C25/20 That the Whistleblower Policy be ratified
- C26/20 That for 2020-2021 season riders nominating for State Championships must be of a good standard only.
- C27/20 That the dates for 2021 State Championships be updated to the following to ensure that all disciplines have held a State Championship prior to the PCA Nationals 26 September to 2 October 2021.

- C28/20 That commencing 2021 PCA NSW affiliations and renewals only be available online and payable by credit/debit card.
- C29/20 That riders nominating to attend any State Championships provide a detailed list of other people who will be attending the event with them to enable the Host Zone to comply with NSW Public Health Orders regarding maximum capacity for each venue and the four square metre rule.
- C30/20 That Clubs, zone and the State office implement all Covid Safe Practices deemed necessary to comply with the NSW Public Health Orders, this information to be circulated to members, as necessary.

- C31/20 To prevent possible cross contamination of Covid-19 at State Championships riders provide their own back numbers, bridle numbers, breast plates, arm bands or other means of identification suitable for each discipline commencing immediately.
- ~~C34/20 That for 2020 Showjumping and Dressage for both One Day Event and Combined Training be held on Saturday with Cross Country only to be held on Sunday.~~
- Note: The Event Organising Committee decided to return to One Day Event held on Saturday and Combined Training to be held on Sunday for horse welfare purposes for riders wishing to compete in both Championships.*
- C35/20 That a refundable volunteer levy be implemented for State Championships with refund provided only if parent/guardian completes their volunteer duties.
- C35/20 That PCA NSW holds a State Tetrathlon and Formal Gymkhana Championship in 2021.
- C35/20 That PCA NSW introduces Tetrathlon as a discipline for a Regional School.
- C36/20 That PCA NSW introduces Tetrathlon at State Camp in 2021
- C37/20 That a review of when State Championship events are held with the recommendation that Mounted Games and Team Sporting move to July school holidays and Showriding and Dressage to the September school holidays.
- C38/20 That riders use their own bridle numbers instead of the State back numbers.
- C39/20 That online scoring be used for the Dressage Championship.
- C40/20 That the following qualifying times for the Sporting Championship be recommended:

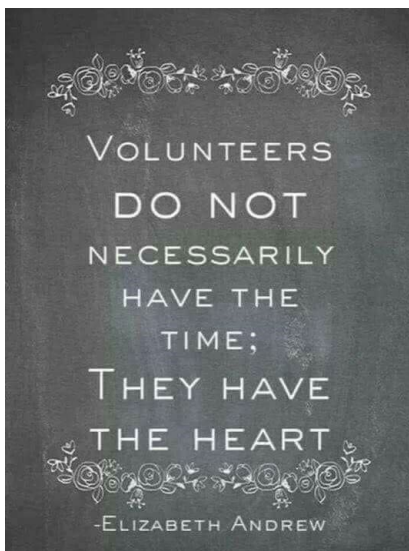
- C41/20 That rings be set for each grade rather than age groups at State Showjumping
- C42/20 That one judge be allocated per arena for State Jumping Equitation and each age group rotate through judges.
- C43/20 That the following games be replaced in Mounted Games for the 2020 Mounted Games Championship:
- Pony Club Poles (Spillers) Race to replace Old Sock Race  
5 Mug Race to replace Hi-Low Race
- C44/20 That due to Covid Safety Guidelines the following game be replaced for the 2020 Mounted Games Championship:
- Fishing Race to replace Rope Race
- C45/20 That Associate Riders be allowed to compete in E grade eventing.

GRADING All club, zone and inter-zone one day events are to be run in grades. Grades are: Associates — Championship, A, B, C, D and E grades. Under 17 (Juniors) — Championship, A, B, C, D and E grades. The Zone Chief Instructor is the final arbiter regarding any grading.

All Clubs and Zones are reminded that if they are incorporated, they must send in an annual return (form A12) after their AGM each year to the Department of Fair Trading along with payment. ## **ACTIVE KIDS REBATE PROGRAM**

The NSW Government Office of Sport will again provide a rebate for 2020 through a voucher system to parents/guardians of school enrolled children. ## **REMINDERS**

### **WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECKS (WWCC)**

All clubs should now be compliant with the Working with Children Check regulations and registered as an 'employer/organisation' to verify their 'employees/volunteers'. A club's status must be reviewed every year and clubs need to complete a risk assessment on anyone 18 years and above to ensure that they are compliant with the Act, website for more details [www.pcansw.org.au](http://www.pcansw.org.au).

It is **illegal** to use a volunteer who has been deemed as needing a Working with Children Check that has not provided their Working with Children Check registration number and been verified unless they have been classified as exempt by their club/zone. Please ensure that records of all roles including their WWCC number of exemption status are held by the authorised persons within the club/zone as audits will be conducted.

It is also **illegal** to utilise a volunteer who has been banned under the Working with Children Check registration system, which is why it is so important for clubs to be registered as 'employers' and for



clubs to verify members so that they can be contacted in the event that a volunteer has been banned.

Clubs must also remember that their Child Safety obligations do not end with Working with Children Checks, clubs need to be mindful of having Child Safe policies and practices, Play by the Rules have some terrific online courses and resources for clubs please see their website for full details - <https://www.playbytherules.net.au/>

## **CONFLICT RESOLUTION**

There are very clear and defined regulations regarding disputes within Pony Club (see the PCA NSW Handbook and Member Protection Policy). Clubs and Zones should appoint a Member Protection Information

Officer (MPIO) to help members with any queries and information regarding rules, regulations, and advice on how to deal with complaints. In all cases conflict should be handled at the lowest level within Pony Club as possible i.e. the channel of communication should be **Member → Club → Zone → State**, this is in accordance with the Australian Sports Commission guidelines.

Member Protection Policy (which the Association has adopted) conflicts or complaints may be dealt with informally or formally and all complaints should be dealt with promptly, seriously, sensitively and confidentially.

All queries and or disputes should be referred in the first instance to the Club/Zone Secretary or President. Complaints should be handled in line with the Member Protection Policy and either referred to an outside mediator, contact Community Justice Centres <http://www.cjc.justice.nsw.gov.au/> or Voluntas <http://www.volunteering.com.au/voluntas/> for help and free mediation or if mediation is unsuitable a Disputes Tribunal Panel may be formed by contacting solicitors from the Australian & New Zealand Sports Law Association (ANZSLA) who list solicitors who are willing to participate on a panel usually pro bono, please see their website for details <http://anzsla.com/content/sports-tribunal-referral-list>

All policies in relation to Codes of Behaviour and our Member Protection Policy as well as a number of other policies can be found on our web site under the Policies tab then go to the general policies. PCA NSW follows the Australian Sports Commission and Communities of Sports and Recreation guidelines and the Association takes these matters seriously.

## **ASSOCIATIONS POLICIES AND PROCEDURES**

All members are reminded that upon joining Pony Club Association NSW they accept the Associations, Constitution, By-laws, Code of Conduct, Membership Protection Policy and All other policies that the Association adopts from time to time. Any member who breaches any of the rules of Pony club including the Code of Conduct may face disciplinary action. Full details of these policies and procedures can be found on the Associations website under the policy tab.

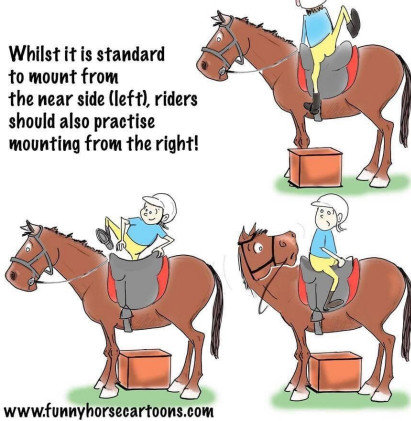
Please remember that all Club, Zone and State Office Bearers are volunteers and should always be treated with respect. These volunteers take on positions to ensure that Pony

## WORK HEALTH AND SAFETY ACT (WHS)

### MOUNTING TIP

Whilst it is standard to mount from the near side (left), riders should also practise mounting from the right!



As you would all be aware the Code of Practice 'Managing Risk When New and Inexperienced Riders or Handlers Interact with Horses In The Workplace' came into effect as at 1<sup>st</sup> February 2017. The impact on Pony Club should be minimal as we were already using the Guide which was in effect prior to 1<sup>st</sup> February. As part of the Associations consultation process the State Office will continue to forward information to all members, Clubs and Zones, outlining Pony Club's responsibilities under the Work Health and Safety Act and if you have any queries, feedback or ideas that you would like to share please do not hesitate to contact the state office.

### PAID INSTRUCTORS AT PONY CLUB

Zones and Clubs are reminded that only those instructors listed on the Paid Instructor Panel list are permitted to be paid for giving instruction at Pony Club. A list of the current PIP can be obtained from the state office or be found on the web site [www.pcansw.org.au](http://www.pcansw.org.au) under the coaching tab.

Please note the change to the procedure as per C62/18 That members of the Paid Instructors Panel be paid directly by the host zone or club. Clubs should still complete the booking form and

submit it as notification of the instruction to the office however they may pay those listed on the panel directly.



*Please note that if clubs/zones use and pay for an instructor who is not on this list they will forfeit Pony Club insurance cover and may be held personally liable in the event of an accident or incident during this instruction.*

## **NCAS SCHOOLS, SPECIALIST AND REGIONAL SCHOOLS**

Zones are reminded that there is a \$550.00 refundable deposit fee for all schools. This fee is refunded once the school has been completed. Cancellations of schools and NCAS assessments will incur this fee unless postponed or cancelled within the required time frame i.e. the last working day four weeks before the school is booked for.

The **2020** fee of \$30.00 per rider applies to all Regional Schools and a \$20.00 fee for PCA NSW members and \$50.00 fee for all non PCA NSW members for Specialist Schools with a minimum of 18 attendees.

This fee is due when booking the school and should be sent as a separate cheque to the refundable deposit. Schools can only be booked through ZCI's and forms can be obtained by contacting Jane Frankum on 02 4229 8977 (Wednesday only) or emailing [coach@pcansw.org.au](mailto:coach@pcansw.org.au).
